#### **The New York State Parenting Education Partnership**

The New York State Parenting Education Partnership (NYSPEP) is a statewide cross-systems initiative designed to ensure all children grow in nurturing families, by enhancing parents' knowledge, skills and behavior. NYSPEP informs and supports close to 2,300 practitioners, program managers, researchers and policymakers to promote, provide and improve evidence-based parenting education. Parenting education<sup>1</sup> is a core component of a comprehensive strategy to strengthen family and community approaches to healthy child development and help prevent child abuse and neglect. When the rate of indicated reports of child abuse is as high as 45/1000 for children ages 0-17 years in some counties in NYS<sup>2</sup>, the capacity of families to raise healthy children and the cost to the larger community must be considered a public health issue. Effective parenting education programs have been linked with better physical, cognitive and emotional development in children; increased parental knowledge of child development and parenting skills; improved parent-child communication; more effective parental monitoring and discipline; reduced youth substance abuse; and decreased rates of child abuse and neglect.

#### **You can join this effort!**

The New York State Parenting Education Partnership (NYSPEP) is accepting applications from local coalitions to strengthen community-based parenting education and support by engaging parents as well as professionals from multiple disciplines. We are looking for community coalitions that demonstrate leadership, commitment and determination to mobilize a broad movement to strengthen and support all parents' skills, knowledge, and talents. Up to four coalition sites will be selected to receive a 1-year award to receive training, technical assistance and a \$5000 grant to support community identified objectives.

#### **Community Coalition Project Goals:**

1. Develop a concentrated, coordinated effort across New York State to strengthen the knowledge, skills and talents of all parents, to support healthy child development and reduce the likelihood of child abuse and neglect.
2. Raise community commitment to promote safe, nurturing relationships and environments for children and families.
3. Establish community norms that support universal and quality parenting education.
4. Support Parenting Educators to develop skills and strategies to provide effective, evidence-based programming.
5. Engage family voice as the foundation for community coalition efforts to identify parenting education needs.

1. Parenting education is a process for helping parents to understand children's development, needs and uniqueness, and their own parental roles and responsibilities by offering strategies, tools, and insight for observing, interpreting, and responding to children's behaviors in order to maximize positive outcomes for both children and families.

## Eligible Applicants

Community coalitions that are working to enhance parenting skills and practice and that supporting families through the Strengthening Families™ Protective Factors Framework<sup>3</sup> are encouraged to apply. NYSPEP is interested in coalitions that are multi-disciplinary and include parents and/or family representation. **It is expected that Parenting Educators and at least two parents will be involved in the coalition.** (Parents are defined for this grant as adults who are the primary custodial caregiver of children.)

The lead applicant must be a Not-for-Profit organization. The coalition can include a wide range of partners, such as, but not limited to: Community Action Agencies, Child Care Resource & Referral agencies and child care providers, libraries, school districts, Cornell Cooperative Extension Associations, health providers, county level services, and representatives from faith-based organizations. Applicants are encouraged to use strength-based approaches that focus on promotion and prevention services which strengthen families, rather than on crisis intervention and treatment services.

## Description of Grant Activities

Community Coalitions selected are expected to participate in all of the activities described below.

- A. *Professional development* - Protective Factors Framework overview, offer regional Strong Roots one-day workshop; support and participate in webinars and a Spring Training Institute, promote and support participation in NYSPEP Parenting Educator Credential; access and disseminate current activities, resources and research through the NYSPEP website and eNews.
  - B. *Parent-partner leadership and community development* – conduct an environmental scan of existing parenting education programs in the community, Community Café training and assistance, support of parent involvement in coalition meetings and trainings including mileage reimbursement and stipends/incentives for families during meetings.
  - C. *Increase access to quality parenting education* - Contribute to the expansion and promotion of NYSPEP searchable database of available parenting education in each county; promotion of the New Parent Guide and New Parent Guide website; promotion of other parenting education resources.
  - D. *Administrative activities* - Use of the PARTNER<sup>4</sup> tool; provide data to NYSPEP through learning collaborative calls and mid year reports; develop “mini-grants” action plan; accept fiscal responsibility for “mini-grants” and agree to share NYSPEP resources and training opportunities.
- A. *Professional Development: Support for the profession of parenting education will focus on:*
- **Strong Roots training days:** These one-day training events emphasize a topic to strengthen parenting educators’ practice and offer a range of evidence-based parenting approaches. These events align with the Parenting Educator Credential competencies and will be planned with support from the NYSPEP Professional Development workgroup and with representatives of the community coalitions who will be recognized as co-sponsors.
  - **Strengthening Families™ Protective Factors Framework** overview
  - **Webinars:** These training opportunities build on the theme of the Strong Roots events and will be based on evidence from research and consistent with the NYS Parenting Educator Credential. The topics will be guided by input from parent and community coalitions and from information gathered during Community Cafés.
  - **Spring Training Institute:** Designed to promote research-to-practice and emerging issues for parenting education practitioners, this one-day event will be organized by the NYSPEP leadership with input from the leads of the community coalitions to engage parenting educators, parent partners, and leaders of parent organizations.
  - **Parenting Educator Credential:** The work to strengthen and promote the NYSPEP Parenting Educator Credential will remain the responsibility of the NYSPEP Credential Work Group and the

NYSPEP Leadership. Community Coalitions will disseminate information about the Parenting Educator Credential.

- **NYSPEP.ORG website and monthly eNews:** NYSPEP promotes best practices and programs and provides current resource information for parent educators and other service providers through the NYSPEP website, that includes an event calendar, and publication of the monthly NYSPEP eNews. These features make communication with parenting educators easier to maintain and promote. Community Coalitions will be invited to contribute to and disseminate the eNews to their partners and mailing lists.

B. *Parent-Partner Leadership and Community Development: Outreach to community and parent/family partners will be developed, strengthened and expanded by focusing on:*

- **Community Cafés:**
  - The Café process begins with a one-day Orientation session held for parents and community-based organization staff to prepare them to implement the model;
  - Following the Orientation, community coalition staff will partner with parent leaders to organize Café Conversations (**at least 5**) for parents and other community leaders to gather to discuss shared concerns. This series of guided conversations will be based on the Strengthening Families™ Protective Factors Framework;
  - Reports of the meetings, known as "harvests," will inform community responsiveness and be shared with NYSPEP to influence state led initiatives.
- **Environmental scan of parenting education programs:** An environmental scan is the process of assessing your current community of parenting education programs, how they are connected to each other, how programs are funded and considering opportunities for partnership. Community Coalitions will implement a community scan which will identify current resources in the community as well as gaps. The results of the scan will be shared with NYSPEP.
- **Support parent participation:** NYSPEP encourages parent engagement in Community Coalition meetings and in Community Café training. To support parent engagement, NYSPEP allocates funds for parents to alleviate the costs of travel and child care. NYSPEP encourages parents to attend Community Café certification opportunities.

C. Increase access to quality Parenting Education

- **Mini-grants:** The grant of \$5000 is intended to increase parenting education opportunities for parents in high need areas. Parents are expected to be included in designing these community-based programs that offer responsive parenting education, address barriers to parenting education (such as implicit bias, and quality child care, accessible locations and times) and support the Strengthening Families™ Protective Factors Framework;
- **Searchable database for parenting support services:** This resource of over 4500 programs is searchable by county location, type of parenting education/support sought. Representative parents from the selected community coalitions will be invited to advise on the usefulness of this database and steps to improve it. Coalitions will contribute community specific resources to the searchable database on the NYSPEP website and will promote use of the database in their communities;
- **Promote quality parenting education resources:**
  - Disseminate *The New Parent* Guide: Starting Life Together, and the companion website [www.nysparentguide.org](http://www.nysparentguide.org). Both resources for expectant and new parents, will be promoted and distributed to the Community Teams.

- Disseminate other materials and messages from NYSPEP and NYSPEP website materials.

#### D. Administrative Activities

- Develop an action plan for the implementation of grant activities and use of the “mini-grant”.
- Participate in the use of PARTNER Tool to assess community collaboration and network.
- Involvement in a learning collaborative with other mini-grantee communities.
- Submit mid-year summary progress, year-end summary reports and financial summary.
- Assume fiscal responsibility for mini-grant funds and support for parent participation in related activities.
- Provide Inventory for 10 families utilizing the Protective Factors Family Assessment Tool.
- Share materials and messages from NYSPEP, such as Professional Development webinar opportunities.

#### **Assistance provided by NYSPEP**

1. NYSPEP Steering Committee and Workgroup members will offer professional expertise, organizational support and access to a network of providers to assist the selected community coalitions in meeting their project goals.
2. NYSPEP project staff will offer ongoing technical support, guidance and oversight on project start up and development needs as identified in partnership with the local community leaders (e.g., community development efforts, partner identification and recruitment). Specific areas of support may include:
  - Assistance with the development of an action plan for the implementation of grant activities and use of the “mini-grant”.
  - Facilitation and implementation of the PARTNER evaluation tool
  - Facilitation of on-site partner meetings.
3. NYSPEP will facilitate peer support through a community coalition learning collaborative. This will include monthly networking calls with the funded community coalitions.
4. Provide an overview of the Strengthening Families™ Protective Factors framework
5. Provide training and technical support for Community Cafés
6. Provide guidance for other project related activities
7. Provide guidance on the distribution of NYSPEP and other parenting education resources.

#### **Selection Criteria:**

NYSPEP is seeking community coalition applicants that exhibit the following:

- Commitment to quality parenting education as demonstrated by:
  - A commitment to enhancing the social-emotional development of children and families and the primary prevention of child abuse.
  - Alignment to the Protective Factors Framework as a central strategy to promote public understanding and professional development.
  - A history of efforts to strengthen opportunities for parenting education (these efforts may address ages birth to 17 years).
  - Use of proven strategies that identify and integrate existing resources to strengthen skills, knowledge and talents of all parents
  - Promotion of community’s readiness to support families (building coalitions for safe, stable, nurturing communities).

- Evidence of commitment to community-based initiatives that are inclusive and represent the population being served. Coalitions must identify their partners, describe their history of working together as a coalition, their efforts to engage multiple community partners and the use of “shared decision making” (meaning a process of partnership of shared views and actions towards shared goals).
- Efforts to and success in the support of family involvement as the foundation to quality parent education by incorporating parent voice in education, health, and social systems. Coalitions must identify at least two parents (in parent role) who will be included as engaged members of the collaboration.
- Commitment to the professional development of parenting educators as demonstrated by support of training for parenting educators, use of credentialed parenting educators, use of evidenced based parenting education practices, and involvement of parenting educators as active members of the coalition.
